When a character has a greater slope than usual, it denotes that it is to-be resolved into two. In this manner r and f are lengthened in the two first marks No. 3, which denote rr and ff respectively.-By adding vowel points, as in the two last examples, these characters may be made to represent fife, and error. Double s and double t, when necessary, may be made by a little break in the middle, which can be effected by slightly varying the track of the pen out of the line it was describing, as in size, taught. When s is preceded by k or q, or when t is preceded by h or w, the same method may be used, as in cause,...



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
